## K.C. Das Commerce College — Down the ages...



K.C. Das Commerce College is a well-known institute for commerce education in the North-East. It is located within the Guwahati city at a distance of 37 Km from the Gopinath Bordoloi Airport and 3 Km from the Guwahati Railway Station.

The college was established on 7th November, 1983. It was an outcome of the untiring efforts of a group of eminent educationalists and free thinkers who felt the need to establish a second commerce college in Guwahati, keeping in mind the growing demand of commerce education in the region. The college was instituted with the financial assistance provided by the present President of the Governing Body, Sri Ramesh Chandra Chaudhury. It has been named in the cherished memory of his father, late Keshab Chandra Das, an educationalist of repute, who was Inspector of Schools, Assam in the 1930s. Beginning its humble origin in the evening shift with an enrolment of 107 students in the premises of Sonaram H.S. & Multipurpose School, Bharalumukh, Guwahati, the college shifted to its permanent campus at Chatribari on 30th November, 1994.

The college came under the deficit-grants-in-aid system in the year 1998 and in course of time was provincialised by the Government of Assam in the year 2005. At present, it has ten departments and it imparts learning to more than 2,400 students with an efficient and dedicated teaching staff. The college has completed 25 years of glorious existence on 7th November, 2008. To mark this momentous occasion of the Silver Jubilee Year of the college, a year-long programme was chalked out for the period which has started from 7th November, 2007 and was culminated on 10th January, 2009

A notable feature in the recent history of the college is that it was assessed by the **National Assessment and Accreditation Council** and was accredited **B+ grade**. This has proved to be an incentive to the staff of the college who are committed in their dedicated efforts to strive for quality and excellence.

#### **Evaluation:**

In all papers including theory and practical, the evaluation will be 20% from continuous internal assessment and 80% from semester end examination. In order to clear a semester, a student will have to obtain minimum pass mark in internal assessment and semester end examination separately. Examination for the bridge course will be conducted by the College and in order to clear the 1st semester a student will have to obtain minimum pass mark in this paper. However the mark obtained in this paper will not be counted in calculating his/her average semester mark.

## **BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)**

The course is of 3 years (6 semesters).

#### Eligibility:

A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10+2) in arts, science or commerce of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC) or any Board or Council recognized by G.U. or who passed the 3 years Diploma Course in Engineering recognized by Gauhati University with at least 50% marks.

## INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING COLLEGE RULES AND DISCIPLINE

The college requires of its students to conform to certain formative regulations, aimed at the growth of the entire college, and more so, of the individual student.

- ☐ General emphasis is laid on discipline and character building. The students are expected to maintain a high standard of discipline in and outside the college campus.
- No student will be allowed to use cell phones inside the college campus. Strict action will be taken against those students who use them in the college campus.
- Students are required to maintain the property of the college. A mass penalty of Rs. 500/will be imposed for destroying college property.
- To maintain a *tobacco free zone*, smoking and chewing paan-masala in the college campus will be treated as acts of major indiscipline. A mass penalty of Rs. 500/- will be imposed for spitting in the class rooms, toilets, staircases or anywhere in the college campus.

#### **CLASS ATTENDANCE**

A student is expected to attend at least 75% of the total lectures delivered. A student attending less than 75% of the total classes will be declared as "Discollegiate" and will not be allowed to appear in the final examination.

#### RULES REGARDING INTERNAL EXAMINATION OF THE COLLEGE

- ☐ There will be two unit tests for all the classes which are compulsory.
- Report cards will be issued after the test examination. The total number of classes attended by the student will be indicated in the report card.
- No student will be allowed to appear in the Final Examination if he or she is unable to secure at least 30% aggregate in the test examination. Admit cards will not be issued to those students.

## **ACADEMIC RESOURCES**



#### **LIBRARY**

K.C. Das Commerce College has a computerized library which makes it a knowledge paradise for every student. Its well-stocked racks with full of latest editions of standard and recommended books of all disciplines attract students to spend more time in the library and make the students highly informed and abreast with the latest trends.

The floor area of the library is 3616 sq.ft. (ground floor) and 2706 sq.ft. (first floor). The ground floor is the library section consisting of more than 13,000 books, journals, periodicals, magazines, national and regional dailies and a small digital collection. The first floor of the library is the reading room with a seating capacity for 150 students at a time. The library is equipped with internal library networking facility, bar-coding facility and internet facility. The library has a Book Bank to facilitate students coming from a poor economic background. The facility of lending books has been extended to the residents of the neighbourhood as well as to the alumni.

### I.T. AND MANAGEMENT CELL

The I.T. & Management Cell was established on 1st September 2003. Since March 2006 it is functioning from its new laboratory on the second floor with a built-up floor area of 910 sq.ft.. The college aims at allowing students to fully develop their professional abilities by imparting market need based training.

The college has arrived at an agreement with a reputed I.T. enabled Academy (ITeA) named COSYNE ENTERPRISES, which has its origin in the United States. A unique feature of Cosyne is that it facilitates students to procure Microsoft Office Specialist Certification after completion of their prescribed courses. These courses are however optional to students on payment.

#### **CONFERENCE - CUM-SEMINAR HALL**



An air conditioned, well-equipped conference-cumseminar hall on modern lines has been built-up on the ground floor and has a capacity of 60 people. The size of this conference is 1560 sq.ft. Official meetings, seminars and discussions are held in this comfortable and spacious hall. There is also a facility of L.C.D. projector.

#### PLACEMENT CELL

The training and placement cell established in our college tries to provide opportunities for the students to get into reputed industries and organizations. Several students were selected in different organizations like IBM, WIPRO & GENPACT where interviews with students are held.

#### YOGA

Yoga classes (Theoretical & Practical) are taken by professional yoga instructor. Practical classes are taken on Sundays. Yoga classes are free of cost and it is open for the residents of the neighbourhood on Sundays.

#### A PARTNER INSTITUTE OF IGNOU

From the session 2008-09, K.C. Das Commerce College has started a partner institute of IGNOU under Convergence Scheme where students are given unique opportunity to acquire quality education in eight different professional courses. The courses are as follows: Bachelor of Social Work, Certificate in Business Skill, Post Graduate Diploma in Environment and Sustainable Development, Diploma in Creative writing in English, Diploma in Youth in Development Work, Certificate in Disaster Management, Certificate in Rural Development and Certificate in Consumer Protection.

### **ADMISSIONS**

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

#### For Higher Secondary (Two Year) Course

To be eligible for admission into Higher Secondary 1st year, a student has to pass the H.S.L.C. examination of SEBA or any other equivalent examination recognized by the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council (AHSEC).

#### For B.Com. (Three Year) Course

To be eligible for admission into B.Com. 1st year, a student has to pass Pre- University/Pre-Degree/Higher Secondary Examination in Arts/Science/Commerce or any other equivalent examination.

#### Procedure

- Application for admission into the college should be made in the prescribed application form issued by the college office on payment of Rs. 150/-.
- Admission to the H.S. course is held after the announcement of the H.S.L.C. examination result and to the B.Com. course after the H.S. Final examination result.
- ☐ The dates of admission to various classes are notified in the local newspapers and in the college notice board.
- Admission to the college is made strictly in order of merit and is governed by the college admission rules.
- The college follows the reservation policy of the Government and the segregation of seats as per quota are:

### **MIGRATION AND ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE**

Students from Boards or Universities other than SEBA, AHSEC and G.U. shall have to produce a Migration Certificate at the time of admission and also obtain an Eligibility Certificate from the AHSEC and Gauhati University.

For admission to the H.S. course, a student from other Boards has to pay a fee of Rs. 100/- to AHSEC to obtain the Eligibility Certificate. For admission to the B.Com. Course, students from

other Boards within Assam (other than AHSEC) has to pay a fee of Rs. 810/- and students from other Boards outside Assam has to pay a fee of Rs.1, 110/- to Gauhati University to obtain the same.

For admission to the BBA and BCA Course, students from other Boards within Assam (other than AHSEC) has to pay a fee of Rs. 810/- and students from other Boards outside Assam has to pay a fee of Rs.5, 110/- to Gauhati University to obtain the same.

The objective of the Students Welfare Fund is to render financial assistance to needy students towards their tuition fees. On application to the Principal, an amount not exceeding the annual tuition fees is granted to the needy students, whose father's / guardian's annual income does not exceed Rs. 3600/- (Rupees three thousand and six hundred only). The college gives financial aid to students affected by natural calamities like earthquake, flood etc. Monetary support is also extended to students participating in various competitions at the State, National or International level.

#### **COLLEGE UNIFORM**


